Fall Fair Junior Prize list

The Rosseau Agricultural Fair is held the last Saturday before Labour Day Weekend. This list is valid for 2015, 2016, 2017.

Rules and Regulations

1. Open to all youth.
2. Youth to exhibit in the school grade completed in June of year of Fall Fair.
3. All entries must be made in current Fall Fair year.
4. Package all bake goods in on a white disposable plate and in a new resealable clear plastic bags. No saran wrap or plastic wrap please.
5. Exhibits to be placed in the hall on Thursday before the fair between 7:00 pm and 9:00 pm or Friday morning between 9:30 am and 11:00 am.
6. Prizes will be awarded on the basis of 25 cents per point with four prizes (1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th).
7. Each youth is allowed only one (1) entry per class.
8. Note: Entrants may exhibit in their own grade category and the grades above their current grade level, but may not exhibit below their grade level. Example: a student at the Junior level could also enter in the Intermediate/Senior level, but not the Primary level.
9. On the Entry tag, make sure to note the appropriate category and the entry number from the current prize list.
10. Incomplete items will not be judged
11. Exhibits CANNOT be removed from the hall before 4:00 pm on Fair Day

Announcement to Parents: Parents are urged to allow children to do the work and the preparation of their exhibits without any assistance. Encourage them in every way, but remember that if you work on the exhibits it defeats the purpose of the Junior Fair.

Trophies

The Plumbing Shop, Rosseau: Offers a trophy to the child in Senior Division (Grade 7-12) with the most points.

Florence Smith in Memory of Conrad: Offers a trophy to the child in Intermediate Division (Grades 4-6) with the most points.

Ross Family: Offers a trophy for the child in the Junior Division (Grade 1-3)with the most points.

S. Bissonette General Contracting: Offers a trophy for the child in the Primary Division (Pre-school, Kindergarten) with the most points.

Doug Chisholm Memorial Trophy: Offers a trophy to the siblings with the most points.

Shadowview Crafts: Offers a trophy for the first three (3) frogs that jump the furthest. Bring your own frog if you wish, but no bull frogs please. Have your frog at the fair by noon.

Rosseau Community Action Committee- Rosseau Recreation Committee: Offers a trophy for the boys and girls nail driving between the ages of 12 to 16 years.
