## RULES AND REGULATIONS


1. Membership fee shall be two dollars (\$2.00) per year, which will be obtained for the ensuing year from prize money of the exhibitor.
2. All members are expected to volunteer a minimum of two (2) hours during the fair week.
3. All products must be property of exhibitor and his/her production. The Directors are empowered to bar any member who does not comply with the rules.
4. Judges are required to change exhibits when not found in the proper class and are authorized to reject any exhibit not worthy of a prize.
5. The decision of the Judge shall be final in all cases, except when a rule of the Society is broken.
6. No person shall be allowed to compete for more than one prize in each category.
7. No person shall be allowed in the showroom or inside the Judge's ring during the awarding of prizes except the Judge and their deputies.
8. Items exhibited as a collection shall not be entered as separate entries.
9. Directors shall take all possible care for the safety of exhibits and the owner must take the risk of injury and loss. Directors will not be responsible for payment of loss or damage of an exhibit (article).
10. Protest if any, to be in writing to the Secretary within 48 hours after closing of the Hall accompanied by a deposit of one dollar (\$1.00). If protest sustained, the deposit will be refunded.
11. Members shall bring entries to the Hall between 7:00pm and 9:00pm on the Thursday before the Fair and the Friday morning between 9:30am and 11:00am.
12. No entries to be removed from the Fair grounds or Hall before 4:00pm the day of the Fair.
13. Whenever the funds of the Society are not sufficient to pay prize money in full, only a percentage (%) of the prize money will be paid.
14. 10 % will be deducted from the prize money of \$5.00 or over, to be used for building and improvements.
15. Entry tags must be attached to all entries. NO straight pins. Entry tags may be obtained from any of the Executive members listed on the cover of fair list before the Fair.
16. Bottles must be 1 Litre / 1 quart, 500 ml / 1 pint or 250 ml / ½ pint sealer jars or as specified for preserves, jams, pickles, jellies, etc. All bottles must be sealed, and wiped clean on the outside. Must be NEW LIDS on all preserves.
17. Every article exhibited, MUST be made by the Exhibitor and must be completed within the current Fair year (August to August).
18. All items shown must be new and not previously used or worn before judging.
19. Directors must check exhibitor's number and confirm correct by initialing entry tag on every entry.


